ELEMENTS:

1. Respond to an emergency situation
2. Perform CPR procedures
3. Communicate details of the incident
4. Review the incident

ASSESSMENT

Assessment is a combination of written questions, practical demonstration of CPR skills based on given scenarios and oral questioning.

As specified in the Assessment Requirements:

HLTAID009 requires CPR on an adult resuscitation manikin to be conducted with the manikin placed on the floor, and an infant resuscitation manikin on a firm surface.

CPR is a physical task that requires exertion of several muscles and joints, and participants should be aware that undertaking this assessment may aggravate any muscular-skeletal condition they may have.

It is recommended that participants wear loose fitting clothing on the day of the practical assessment class.
