ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Individuals undertaking this course will be expected to have suitable language, literacy, numeracy and digital skills, good verbal and written communication skills, and be required to undertake a Pre-Enrolment Interview and a Language, Literacy, Numeracy and Digital Skills assessment.



COURSE OUTLINE

In the Certificate III in Individual Support (Ageing), you'll gain the necessary skills to build a rewarding career working in an industry that needs more qualified professionals. You will provide physical, social and emotional support to clients to help them stay independent for as long as possible.

Through a mix of theory and practical coursework, you will learn how to:

- help clients with personal care needs including bathing, toileting and dressing
- identify healthy body systems
- work in palliative care and dementia care
- help clients with their social and emotional health
- assist clients to move safely from one spot to another
- build relationships with carers and families
- · communicate effectively with clients, carers and families
- apply basic principles and practices of infection prevention and control

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

To obtain your qualification, a successful completion a total of 15 units needs to be completed. This consists of 9 core units and 6 elective units.

In addition to the completion of the units, you will be required to complete a minimum of 120 hours vocational placement within a Disability setting. Yarrawonga Mulwala Community & Learning Centre (YMCLC) is responsible for organising vocational placement.

You will be required to obtain or hold a current Working with Children's Check (WWCC) to enable participation in the vocational placement component of the course. A volunteer WWCC is free.

You will also be required to complete a Police Check, the cost of which is included in your course fees.
